Your Board of Directors allocates excess margins to your patronage account by year based on the percentage of dollars you paid to RVEC during that year. Your Board of Directors approved retiring the general patronage allocated for 1997, 1998 and partial retirement for 1999. If you were a memberowner during that year, your check was issued the beginning of December. We ask that you cash your check promptly.

Every year the Board of Directors reviews the Cooperative's financial position to determine when additional refunds will be made. 18.17.04

Member-owner economic participation is one of the seven cooperative principles followed by RVEC and rural electric cooperatives across the country. RVEC member-owners contribute equitably to, and democratically control, the capital of the cooperative.

**CEO** Comments

As a member-owner of RVEC, you are accumulating equity in the co-op as you use electricity each year. In fact, each member-owner has a patronage allocation account on file which tracks the credit or equity accumulated each year. The cooperative is a not-for-profit organization, but when we experience additional income over expenses at the end of the year - referred to as margins - we allocate ack to our member owner.

that extra money back to our member-owner.

These funds are allocated to your patronage allocation account and returned to you over time when the board determines that it is financially feasible to do so. In October, the RVEC Board approved the retirement of allocated patronage for all of 1997 and 1998 and a portion of 1999. If you were a member-owner in those years, you should of received a patronage retirement check the beginning of December. This is RVEC's patronage system at work for you, the member-owner. 08.28.01

In April of this year, the Directors elected to make a one-time early retirement. This was a portion of the 2020 patronage allocation to the member-owners. Like the allocation, your share of this special retirement is calculated from the amount of kilowatt hours you purchased in 2020.

Allocation and retirement (return) of patronage to member-owners is an important difference between electric cooperatives and investor-owned utilities. RVEC does not have stockholders.

It is the responsibility of your Board of Directors to set sound financial policy and the duty of management to properly care for the assets of RVEC. We are pleased to provide you, the memberowner, with these returns of equity in your cooperative.

#### **Basin Scholarship**

Dependents of members of RVEC are eligible to apply for a \$1,000 scholarship to be provided by Basin Electric Power Cooperative, power supplier of RVEC.

The scholarship program is designed to encourage and recognize the achievements of a student living on electric cooperative lines. The scholarship must be used for educational costs and the student must enter college in the fall of the school year for which the scholarship is given. The applicant must be a student who is enrolled or planning to enroll in a full-time graduate or undergraduate course of study at an accredited, two-year or four-year college, university or vocational/technical school. This scholarship is awarded without regard to other awards, loans or financial assistance the applicant may have obtained. Award of the scholarship is based on the following criteria: SAT/ACT scores, grade-point average, work experience, participation in school and community activities, a statement by the student explaining his/her educational and career goals and a written recommendation by a third party.
